

GUIDE OF GOOD ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTICES FOR TEH AUTHORISED STAFF

□ Even if you are a member of the authorised staff, you must, just as the other people attending the event, follow the environmental rules and recommendations given by the organisation both before and during the event.

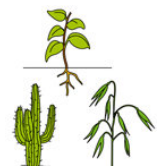


□ Whenever possible, use the lookouts prepared for the spectators. If you need to get out of these areas in order to better do your job, try to do so in places close to the marked track, a lookout or areas that intersect with roads accessible by car.



□ If you take photos or film a video in any point of the track or the surrounding areas, do so by respecting the natural environment. The media coverage of the event does not justify causing any damage to the environment.

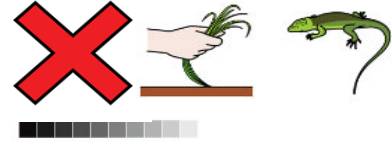
□ Remember not to step on any of the especially fragile places surrounding the event, since it could alter its natural conditions or disturb the local flora and fauna.



□ *Drones or any other flying device used to film are limited by the law in public and natural spaces, and so the organisation recommends not to use them even if it is legal to use them: remember that we will be in an area used by birds and the use of these devices could disturb or even damage them.*



- Try not to damage the plants or animals you may find on the track itself or the surrounding areas. Also try not to get into areas where you could disturb the terrain and its elements, such as sand dunes, vegetation, volcanic terrain, etc.



- Avoid causing noise, rising your voice or using sound devices outside of the urban areas through which the race takes place. Remember that we will be in an area that is especially sensitive for birds and this kind of actions can be very harmful to them.

- Remember not to leave any marks or signs on the terrain or any other element of the environment.



- We must take care of our environment together. Try not to leave any sort of rubbish around the environment. If you need to get rid of any sort of waste, you can do so by using the skips that can be found in the starting line/finish line areas and the one usually found in the urban areas through which the race will take place.
